## The Link Letter – Anyone for camping?

We hope you have had good holidays and have been rested, refreshed and inspired for the year ahead. Would anyone fancy an additional camping holiday between 4-11 October? In Israel, people will be sleeping outside at this time under booths as they celebrate the Feast of Tabernacles remembering the 40 years they spent in the wilderness living in tents. During that time they could see the Presence of God covering them with His cloud by day and warming them at night by His fiery presence.

The feast of Tabernacles is also called the Feast of Ingathering when we give thanks for the harvest and all that God provides. During the 40 year "wilderness experience", all their needs were taken care of.

The Feast of Tabernacles also looks forward to the time when Jesus will return and establish his reign from Jerusalem; don't we pray "Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven"! It will be a time when all the nations learn of the great things that happen when people follow the ways of God as His peace spreads out from Jerusalem to encompass the whole world. Understanding the Messianic connection of Jesus to the Feast of Tabernacles even helps us grasp something of the mystery of His incarnation: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14).The word "dwelt" here in the Greek means "tabernacled." When He became flesh, Jesus inhabited the temporary shelter of an earthly body, knowing He soon would be required to leave it. Why did He do it? So that we might find a home in Him – not a temporary shelter in the wilderness, but an eternal home in a Kingdom that abides forever.
