

Bishop Sutton Community Church Letter:

100 years ago, General Allenby was charged by the war cabinet to liberate Jerusalem without firing on the people or the city. How on earth was it to be done? Allenby asked his superiors... "Pray", came the answer from above. This didn't seem to be very helpful at the time, but Allenby prayed and came across the work of Bible scholar, Dr H. Aldersmith who in 1898, believed Jerusalem would be delivered by Great Britain in 1917. Aldersmith based part of his belief on the words of prophet Isaiah 31v.5:

Like birds flying about, So will the LORD of hosts defend Jerusalem.

Defending, He will also deliver it; Passing over, He will preserve it."

He was convinced that the UK would have a part to play in the restoration of Jerusalem, and that it would be accomplished by some kind of flying machine (5 years before the Wright brothers took their first flight in 1903).

The Turks who had ruled Palestine for 400 years believed they would never be defeated saying "*When the waters of the Nile flow into Palestine, then will a prophet of the Lord come and drive the Turks out of this land!*" But... General Allenby's name translated into Arabic was Allah (God)-en-Nebi (Prophet) or the Prophet of God; and in order to supply British troops in the desert, water from the Nile was brought across the desert by pipeline with many thousands of gallons flowing into Palestine each day in 1917.

Allenby dropped notes from airplanes over Jerusalem with the words which read in Arabic "Surrender the city! The Prophet of God". His troops surrounded the City leaving an escape route to the south and from the evening of December 8, Turkish troops fled the City. By early morning all had gone, Jerusalem was delivered and not a shot was fired!

From sunset on December 8th to sunset December 9th that year was the 24th day of Kislev, the 9th month of the Jewish year. 25 Centuries earlier the prophet Haggai had foretold the deliverance of Jerusalem on this very day (see Haggai 2:18-22).
